As Aggies worldwide prepared to observe Muster, the Aggie Network received news that we had lost another one of our own in Iraq. 1LT. Doyle M. Hufstedler III '01 was killed in action March 31 near Fallujah along with four other soldiers with the Army's 1st Infantry Division when a bomb exploded beneath their armored personnel carrier.

A 2002 A&M graduate in industrial distribution from Abilene, Hufstedler was a member of Company I-1 in the Corps of Cadets.

Hufstedler met his wife, Leslie Chesson '01, at A&M, and the two were married in August 2002. After graduation, he completed his Army training at Ft. Riley, Kansas, and was deployed to Iraq a year later.

Hufstedler is survived by his wife, Leslie, and infant daughter, Grace Ashley, as well as his parents, Kathleen and Doyle M. Hufstedler Jr., and three sisters.
