### PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

The purchase of any travel services offered by Group Voyagers, Inc. ("the Company") constitutes a contractual arrangement between you and the Company, and represents your acceptance of the Company Terms and Conditions. Full Terms and Conditions will be forwarded to you by calling 877-303-7735. Please ensure that you read and understand these Terms and Conditions prior to deposit.

**Standard Deposit & Final Payment:** A non-refundable, non-transferable deposit of \$250 per tour per person is required for us to reserve space for you. Your booking is not confirmed until the deposit is received by the Company and you receive a confirmation invoice. Final payment is due 65 days prior to commencement of services. If we do not receive final payment by the due date, we reserve the right to cancel the reservation and retain your full deposit. We are not responsible for canceled land or air reservations in the event payment is not received by the final payment date. Payment in full is required at time of booking for reservations made within 65 days of departure. An additional \$250 non-refundable deposit (total \$500 non-refundable) is required for air booked in conjunction with any tour (i.e. air-inclusive tour). The following taxes and fees will be added to your trip price if you book an air-inclusive tour with the Company and are dependent upon your itinerary. Please ask your Group Voyager Inc. representative at time of reservation for more information.

• September 11th Security Fee up to \$10 per person; Passenger facility charges up to \$18 per person; Federal domestic flight segment fees up to \$3.50 per segment; U.S. and International arrival and departure, and other government imposed fees up to \$300 per person

**Cancellations & Cancellation Fees:** If cancellation is received by the Company before the final payment date of your tour, your non-refundable deposit will be retained in addition to any airline-imposed fees or penalties up to 100% of the fare. For individual reservations, the following per person cancellation fees apply. Total price does not include discounts, promotions, or special incentives.

65-22 days prior to commencement of services: 20% of total price; 21-8 days prior to commencement of services: 30% of total price; 7-1 days prior to commencement of services: 50% of total price; On departure day and later: 100% of total price.

If flight changes—including flight cancellations or name changes—are requested after full land and air deposit is received, revision fees, change fees, or airline cancellation fees will apply up and may be up to 100% of the ticket price. Cancellation penalties will be quoted at time of cancellation. The Company reserves the right to cancel or reschedule any tour departure for any reason. If a tour is canceled prior to departure, the Company's only responsibility will be to refund to the passenger the amount we have received for the reservation. The Company cannot assume responsibility for any additional costs or any fees relating to the issuance and/or cancellation of air tickets or other travel arrangements not made through the Company. There are no refunds for unused services of less than 48 consecutive hours or for voluntary modifications made by the traveler.

**Revision Fees:** A fee of \$30 per transaction will be charged for any alteration or revision made to a reservation. Airline penalties may also apply and may be up to 100% of the full ticket price.

**Air Arrangements:** The Company is not responsible if an airline cancels, reschedules, or delays a flight for any reason. Globus is not responsible for and will not provide any refund for portions of trips missed or expenses incurred due to canceled, rescheduled or delayed flights. If you make your own flight arrangements, the Company will not be responsible for any loss resulting from cancellation or changes in international gateways or travel dates. Baggage fees imposed by airlines (including internal air) are not included in the price and are payable by the passenger directly to the airline.

**Travelers Who Need Special Assistance On Tours and/or Cruise:** You must report any disability requiring special attention while on tour or on cruise to the Company at the time the reservation is made. Most transportation services, including the touring motorcoach, are not equipped with wheelchair ramps. We cannot provide individual assistance to a tour participant for walking, dining, getting on and off motorcoaches and other vehicles, or other personal needs. A qualified and physically able companion must accompany travelers who need such assistance and must assume full responsibility for their well being.

**Young Travelers:** Travelers who are less than 18 years old on the departure date must be accompanied by an adult and share an adult's accommodations throughout the duration of the tour. We do not accept children under 8 years old. Children 8-17 receive a 10% discount of the base land package price.

**Price Policy:** All tour prices are based on rates (reflecting foreign exchange rates) known at the time of publication and expected to be in effect at the time of departure, and do not include airfare except when noted. Tour prices are per person, based on double occupancy. Single room supplements are listed where applicable. Not all accommodation types are available on all tours. Prices are subject to increase without notice, subject to the guarantee set forth below.

Once the Company has received your full deposit for any land-only tour that base land tour price is guaranteed and you are protected against any base land price increase due to currency surcharges. Any subsequent cost increases are at our expense, not including energy cost increases and/or any government tax increases. Air-inclusive tours, and/or land-only tours which include air between cities (internal air), are guaranteed when the Company has received your full land and air deposit (subject to air arrangements noted above). The Company reserves the right to ticket passengers upon receipt of full land and air deposit and thus any subsequent changes made at your request are subject to airline imposed change fees and/or changes in airfare price which are the responsibility of the passenger to pay.

**Visas & Passports:** You are responsible for obtaining and paying for all visas and entry documents, for meeting all health and other requirements, and for any documents required by the laws, regulations, orders, and/or requirements of the countries you will visit. It is your responsibility to verify all visa and passport requirements.

**Responsibility:** Group Voyagers, Inc., located at 5301 South Federal Circle, Littleton, Colorado 80123, is an independent company ("the Company") licensed to market and distribute travel products under the Globus brand name, and arrange for the tour services offered in its brochure, including transportation, sightseeing, and accommodations through independent contractors.

The air carriers, accommodations, and other suppliers (including but not limited to trains, cruises, ferries, motorcoaches, hotels, and restaurants) providing services are independent contractors and are not agents, employees, servants, or joint venturers of the Company or its affiliates. All certificates and other travel documents for services issued by the Company are subject to the Terms and Conditions specified by the supplier, which are available upon request, and to the laws of the countries in which the services are supplied. The international carriage of passengers is subject to international conventions and treaties, where applicable. These international agreements limit and, in some events, exclude the carrier's liability to passengers (tour participants). Where any claim or part of a claim (including those involving death or personal injury) concerns or involves any travel arrangements (including the process of getting on or off the transport concerned) provided by any air, sea, inland waterways, rail, or road carrier or any stay in a hotel, the Company's maximum liability is the maximum which would be payable by the carrier or the hotel keeper concerned under the applicable international convention, treaty, or regulation applicable to the travel arrangements or hotel stay (e.g., the Warsaw Convention, the Montreal Convention for international travel by air, the EU Regulation on Air Carrier Liability for air carriers with an operating license granted by an EU country, the Athens Convention for international travel by sea) in that situation.

After departure, if the services included in the tour cannot be supplied or there are changes in an itinerary for reasons beyond the control of the Company, the Company will arrange for the provision of comparable services. Any resulting additional expense will be the responsibility of tour participants, and any resulting savings will be refunded by the Company to tour participants.

The Company reserves the right to accept or reject any person as a tour participant; to expel any participant from the tour; to make changes in the itinerary whenever the Company deems it necessary for the comfort, convenience, or safety of the participants; and to cancel a tour at any time.

The tour participant agrees that neither the Company nor its affiliates shall be liable for any damage, loss (including personal injury, death, and property loss), or expense occasioned by any act or omission of any supplier providing services, or any other person.

Any dispute between the tour participant and the Company directly or indirectly relating to the Terms and Conditions shall be first submitted to mediation at Denver, Colorado, before a mediator mutually agreed to by the parties. If mediation is not successful, the dispute must be resolved by binding arbitration under Colorado law before the Judicial Arbitrator Group or its successor located at 1601 Blake Street, Denver, Colorado 80202. The prevailing party shall be entitled to an award of costs and reasonable attorneys' fees. Any action to enforce the arbitrator's decision shall be brought in the state or federal courts in the State of Colorado.

Arbitration against the Company must be commenced within one year following the date of tour completion. Neither the Company nor any affiliate shall in any case be liable for other than compensatory damages, and you hereby waive any right to punitive damages.

No person, other than an authorized representative of the Company by a document in writing, is authorized to vary, add, or waive any term or condition in its brochure, including any term or condition set forth in the preceding provisions.

# BONNIE SCOTLAND

## 9 days



**Day 1 (Wed.)** Board your overnight transatlantic flight.

### Day 2 Arrive in Glasgow, Scotland.

(Thu.) Check into your hotel. The rest of the day is free for you to relax in Scotland's largest city. At 6 pm, meet your Tour Director and traveling companions for a welcome dinner at your hotel. (D)

### Day 3 Glasgow–Fort William–Isle of Skye.

(Fri.) Your tour of Bonnie Scotland starts in earnest with a day full of spectacular scenery. Follow the "Bonnie Banks" of Loch Lomond and enter the Highlands. Wild Rannoch Moor; Glen Coe, where the MacDonald Clan was treacherously massacred by the Campbells; lovely Loch Linnhe; and Fort William beneath Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain, are on the morning's agenda. Then, follow the "Road to the Isles" passing Glenfinnan, the site where the Young Pretender's standard was raised in 1745. At Mallaig, board your FERRY and sail across the Sound of Sleat to Armadale on the romantic Inner Hebridean Isle of Skye, where Bonnie Prince Charlie and Flora MacDonald took refuge. (B,D)

**Day 4 Isle of Skye–Inverness–Culloden–Elgin.** (Sat.) Cross the bridge back to the mainland and drive further into the remote Highlands for another day of breathtaking Scottish scenery. Follow the shores of Loch Carron to Achnasheen, pause at Drumnadrochit on the shores of Loch Ness, and keep a lookout for the mysterious monster on the way to Inverness, the Highland capital. At CULLODEN VISITOR CENTRE the scene is set of the crushing Hanoverian victory over Bonnie Prince Charlie's Scottish clans before reaching your overnight destination in Elgin. (B,D)

**Day 5 Elgin–Pitlochry–Dundee.** (Sun.) Start the day with a unique treat: admire a champion shepherd as he manipulates his flock with up to 10 border collies in a SHEEPDOG DISPLAY. Then, enjoy spectacular highland scenery as you drive through Cairngorms National Park and Glen Garry to the Victorian mountain resort of Pitlochry. This afternoon, visit a WHISKY DISTILLERY, where your

guide explains the ancient art of converting barley, water, and yeast into a heart-warming liquor. Stay the night in the city of Dundee overlooking the picturesque Firth of Tay. (B,D)

**Day 6 Dundee–St. Andrews–Edinburgh.** (Mon.) A leisurely start to the day with a drive across the Tay Bridge to St. Andrews, whose Royal and Ancient Golf Club, founded in 1754, has given us the rules of golfing. An exciting inclusion is the opportunity to join a Local Guide for a walk along the fairways of the famous OLD COURSE. Continue on to Perth and a special visit to SCONE PALACE, the stately home of the Earl and Countess of Mansfield. During your welcome over coffee and shortbread, hear about the crowning of Scottish kings here, then join your guide on a private tour of the Murray family home. Plenty of time later to explore the palace grounds. Cross the mighty Forth Road Bridge to Edinburgh and tonight, don't miss our optional Scottish evening with Highland dancers, bagpipers, and the Ceremony of the Haggis. (B)

**Day 7 Edinburgh.** (Tue.) Morning city sightseeing with a Local Guide introduces you to the 200-year-old "New Town" and famous scientists, inventors, and novelists. In the "Old Town," drive up the narrow Royal Mile to EDINBURGH CASTLE to admire Scotland's Crown Jewels. The afternoon is free to enjoy this "Prince of Cities" at your own pace. Later, a unique optional experience: board the former *Royal Yacht Britannia*, once the perfect royal residence for the Queen's glittering state visits and family holidays. Tour five decks and see how the Royal Family and crew of 240 lived and worked on board. Dinner rounds off this optional evening. Tickets are included for tonight's performance of the world-renowned MILITARY TATTOO, a vast spectacle of massed Scottish pipe bands that takes place in an arena on the esplanade of Edinburgh Castle. (B)

**Day 8 Edinburgh–New Lanark–Glasgow.** (Wed.) A fascinating visit this morning to the NEW LANARK WORLD HERITAGE SITE, which by the late 1700s was already Britain's largest cotton mill complex. On arrival, your specialist guide will orientate you with the history of the mill and tell you about the social pioneer owner. Then, view the pretty Falls of Clyde, whose water powered the mill wheels. See the massive looms in action, wander around the village, and imagine how people lived and worked here. Back in vibrant Glasgow a final orientation drive takes in the fine 12th-century cathedral, imposing university buildings, and elegant Georgian squares built by the wealthy tobacco barons. Time for last-minute shopping before enjoying a farewell dinner at your hotel. (B,D)

**Day 9 (Thu.)** Your homebound flight arrives the same day. (B)
