

JUL 24: SEATTLE, WASHINGTON

Depart 5PM

Embark on your luxury cruise aboard Regatta in Seattle, Washington's waterfront city and home of the famed Space Needle.

JUL 25: CRUISING THE INSIDE PASSAGE

Cruise the Inside Passage along Canada's scenic west coast into Alaska's more sheltered Inside Passage, a stunning waterway dotted with islands and edged by verdant forests, mountains and glaciers.

JUL 26: KETCHIKAN, ALASKA Arrive 9am-Depart 11pm

Built around salmon canneries and sawmills, Ketchikan was once proclaimed the Salmon Capital of the World. Its unique culture is celebrated through its renowned collection of totem poles, an accolade to Native art. Situated at the foot of Deer Mountain, Ketchikan is backed by steep, forested slopes and fringed by a pristine waterfront, creating an impossibly beautiful backdrop. Not far in the distance is the Tongass National Forest—the nation's largest—abundant with wildlife and the peaceful aura of the North Country.

JUL 27: WRANGELL, ALASKA

Arrive 8AM-Depart 5PM

Situated near the mouth of the Stikine River, this small and friendly city still honors its dramatic past. Once a Tlingit Indian stronghold, then a Russian settlement, later a British trading post, and ultimately purchased by the U.S., Wrangell commemorates the changes it has endured. Its museum offers insight into the three gold rushes that transformed the area and a glimpse of its native past can be found at a traditional Tlingit tribal house.

JUL 28: JUNEAU, ALASKA

Arrive 8AM-Depart 7PM

Founded in 1880 when Joe Juneau and Richard Harris struck gold, the thriving town of Juneau offers an eclectic mix of people and pastimes. This is the capital of Alaska, but politics is only a small part of the experience here. The downtown streets feature upscale shopping with a traditional twist among authentic Alaskan totems and art, while spectacular mountain scenery stuns from every angle. The famous Mendenhall Glacier is just outside town, and even a casual observer is likely to spot bald eagles, humpback whales and perhaps even a black bear.

JUL 29: CRUISING HUBBARD GLACIER

A journey to Alaska would not be complete without viewing the majestic Hubbard Glacier. As Alaska's longest tidewater glacier, its unrivaled proportions stretch over six miles, offering dramatic vistas of sparkling blue ice. As the towering glacier moves and calves, crashing chunks of ice fall into the bay and create a sound called 'white thunder' by the Tlingit people.

JUL 30: SKAGWAY, ALASKA Arrive 9AM—Depart 5PM

Located at the northwest end of the Alaska Marine Highway, Skagway was known to thousands of hopeful gold rushers as the gateway to the gold fields. Today this delightful town retains the flavor of the gold rush era and the character of colorful inhabitants such as Soapy Smith, the "King of the Frontier Con Men," especially on Broadway, with its false-front buildings and in the Trail of '98 Museum, with its outstanding collection of gold fever memorabilia.

JUL 31: SITKA, ALASKA Arrive 8am—Depart 3pm

Historically significant and vibrantly multicultural, Sitka is not only the storyteller of some of the state's most compelling history, but breathtakingly beautiful as well. First called Shee Atika by the Tlingit Indians, and then New Archangel by the Russians who ousted them, this city claims itself the cultural center of southeast Alaska. Its fascinating museums house some of the state's oldest native culture collections, while the Sitka National Historical Park boasts totem-lined forest trails and authentic artisan exhibits.

AUG 2: VICTORIA, B.C., CANADA Arrive 1PM—Depart 11PM

Rich with British heritage and overflowing with cosmopolitan charm, Victoria is a town where High Tea and world-class flower gardens are part of everyday life.
