Days 1/2/3~Saturday/Sunday/Monday ~ February 6/7/8 Houston ~Bangkok

Your journey begins as you board your flight in Houston. Crossing the international dateline, you'll arrive in in Bangkok on Day 3, where you will be welcomed by your Classic Escapes guide and transferred to your hotel. (Meals Aloft)

En route you will have your first taste of this frantic and steamy tropical city that offers surprises at every turn. Gleaming skyscrapers, glittering temples, colorful street markets, sophisticated shopping malls, bustling nightlife, and vibrancy reflect the incredible economic growth of the last few years. A booming, modern capital, Bangkok still manages to retain its unique Siamese heritage in its wonderful food, culture, exotic architecture, Buddhist tolerance and Thai hospitality. The new "Skytrain," a symbol of Bangkok's rapid development, provides not only a convenient way to get around the main areas, but also some great views over a capital in constant change.

DAY 4~TUESDAY~FEBRUARY 9 BANGKOK/THONBURI/EMERALD BUDDAH/ JIM THOMPSON'S HOUSE



After a leisurely breakfast, travel by boat through the remaining klongs, or canals, that have earned Bangkok the nickname "Venice of the East." Along the way, spot family homes built on stilts and glittering temples while observing the traditional way of life along the water. Stop to view Wat Arun (Temple of the Dawn), whose towering spire has becomes a symbol of the city.

Visit the Grand Palace, the most important center of Thai culture. The Palace was once the royal abode, but today is used mainly for ceremonial functions. Tourists are allowed

inside to see the Emerald Buddha, the displays of royal artifacts and memorabilia, and wall decorations.

Note: You will need to wear long pants and shoes which cover the heels to enter here. You must do this to pay respect to the Thai people.





After having lunch at the Supatra River House restaurant, you'll make your way to a quiet street in the center of the city to find the Jim Thompson House and Silk Shop. Working first for the American CIA, Thompson became an authority on an art, assembling a collection that attracted scholars from all over the world. He gained worldwide recognition for his success in rebuilding the silk industry, for generating international demand for Thai silk and for generally contributing to the growth of the industry. The house is a work of art in itself and one of Bangkok's landmarks

This evening, enjoy dinner, accompanied by Thai classical music and dancing. Once performed in the inner-court only for royalty, every hand gesture has a significant meaning. In the background, expert musicians demonstrate their considerable skills with ancient instruments exclusively designed for Thai classical music. You will be amazed by the grace and beauty of the dancers as they elegantly perform stories from classical Thai literature and folk-tales. The exquisitely crafted traditional costumes adorned with jewels provide the perfect photo opportunity.

Day 5~Wednesday~February 10 Chao Phraya River/Ayutthaya

After breakfast, transfer to the River City Pier, where you will board the Grand Pearl (8:30 am) for a trip along the Chao Phraya River, the River of King. Sit back, relax and enjoy this unique way to take in sights including the Grand Palace and the Temple of Dawn. Lunch is served on board prior to disembarking. Arrive Nonthaburi at Wat Chonglom Pier, and transfer by private vehicle to the north of Bangkok, and onto the ancient city of Ayutthaya, the former capital of Siam. Enjoy the balance of your day at leisure.

Your hotel for the evening is the Kantary Hotel. Centrally located among the ancient ruins of Ayutthaya, Kantary Hotel features air

conditioned rooms decorated in contemporary Asian style. The spacious rooms feature balconies and internet access, and there is a state of the art fitness center with a sauna and steam room.

Day 6~Thursday~February 11 Ayutthaya ~ Khao Yai National Park

Explore the ruins of Ayutthaya, a UNESCO World Heritage Site – the once magnificent capital of the Thais, praised by foreign emissaries as the finest city they had ever seen. Surrounded by rivers and a canal, it flourished under 33 Siamese kings from 1350 until the Burmese destroyed it in 1767. Enjoy lunch at the PB Valley Khao Yai Winery on your way to Khao Yai National Park.

Resume your drive to Khao Yai, considered one of the best preserved national park tracts of evergreen forest in all of Indochina and noted for its larger forest birds and spanning four provinces. Khao Yai National Park has a variety of terrains





from deciduous forest to savannah and houses some 3,000 species of plant. Wildlife in the park is as varied as its terrain and it is home to more than 70 mammal species including elephants, white handed gibbon, gaur, Asiatic black bear and wild dog, and a major bird population –over 350 species–including a wide variety of hornbills. The entire area is crisscrossed by hiking trails, ranging in length from one to five miles. There are also many waterfalls, the tallest and most

spectacular of which is Haew Narok at 260-ft.

Your luxury hotel is one of the newest in the area with an open architecture which merges perfectly with nature. The 115 guestrooms and suites provide fabulous views of the verdant hills of the national park and have balconies from which to absorb the fragrant air of the area. With a complimentary minibar and all amenities, the rooms offer all comforts of home. Light and modern in style, with wooden furnishings, an enormous picture window and a balcony, the Botanica Studio has a choice of views including mountains, the valley, and the resort gardens and pool. Tempo restaurant fronting the mountain serves up a variety of delectable international and Thai cuisines, light snacks, irresistible



desserts, fruit juices, and a full drinks list including world wines.

DAY 7~FRIDAY~FEBRUARY 12 KHAO YAI NATIONAL PARK

Explore the forested hills, rivers and waterfalls of Thailand's oldest and most revered national park. Search for several species of hornbills that abound in Khao Yai and some of the other 350 bird species that include trogrons, laughing thrushes, barbets and Siamese Firebacks. Although elusive and difficult to spot, wildlife in the park is as varied as its terrain and home to more than 70 mammal species, including elephant, white-handed gibbon and Asiatic black bear. As the sun sets look for the Great Eared Nightjar and Brown Boobook,



plus visit a bat cave to see thousands of bats as they emerge into the night.

DAY 8~SATURDAY~FEBRUARY 13 BANGKOK~CHIANG RAI

After breakfast, transfer to the Bangkok airport for your flight to Chiang Rai. Upon arrival, continue to the infamous Golden Triangle, known for centuries as the center of the opium trade. Here, the illicit crops have long since been replaced by the small tourist village of Sob Ruak and the only opium found is in the Golden Triangle museums.

An exciting long-tail boat ride along the Mekong River follows with spectacular views of the Laotian countryside. Enjoy lunch and a visit to a local opium museum. Drive to Mae Sai, the northernmost point of Thailand, and one of the few official land crossings between Thailand and Burma. Observe border life and enjoy some fantastic shopping opportunities in the local shops selling Burmese lacquer ware, precious gems and jade.





Embrace tranquility and mother-nature at your hillside boutique spa just outside of Mae Chan. Breathtaking views are had from each of the 34 rooms with all of the furnishings indigenously made of bamboo, from the tables and chairs, to the door handles and light fixtures and even the clothing hangers and soap dishes. Each room is void of a television and alarm clock allowing the environment to be your alarm clock and entertainment as you awaken to the sound of birds singing and an incredible view of the sun rising over the horizon. A small pool and restaurant with panoramic views complete this exotic oasis.

DAY 8~SUNDAY~FEBRUARY 14 CHIANG RAI

For many visitors to Thailand, their trips to the small mountain villages in the north of the country remain one of their most unforgettable experiences. Surrounded by great natural beauty, these special destinations have enriched the lives of countless visitors who have gone home having experienced these ancient cultures.




Originating in different parts of Southeast Asia, mostly southern China, and resisting persecution by other cultures, they have migrated into Thailand in a quest for freedom and security. There are six large minority ethnic groups in the north of Thailand, in addition to several smaller communities. Each tribe has its own unique characteristics and identity, which are expressed through and reflected in its diverse cultures, distinctive costumes, and ornaments, musical instruments, weaving products, weapons, and its selection of location for setting up a village, etc. Of these, the two most prominent hill tribes are the Lisu and Akha.

Extroverts, cheerful and friendly people, the Lisu have an unquenchable spirit. They are enterprising and adaptable, smart and self-confident. Although happy



to integrate with the dominant Thai community, they retain t heir customs. The women wear brightly colored costumes, consisting of a blue or green



The Akha people are famous for their very exotic and beautiful costumes, and can be seen in many towns in northern Thailand selling their unique handicrafts. They are not known for their shyness, and one can easily find oneself engaged in an animated bargaining session with these gregarious salespeople.

Today, visit the Hill Tribe Villages and enjoy an Akha cultural and lifestyle show at Lojas Village. Learn about the women wearing the famous brass rings around their necks at the Karen Long Neck Village, the elaborate, colorful dresses of the Lisu at Ban Bangjars and the only Hill Tribe to have a written language, the Yao at Ban Pong Takham.

Day 9~Monday~February 15 Chiang Rai~Chiang Mai

After breakfast, transfer from Chiang Rai to Chiang Mai, stopping at Doi Suthep along the wayto visit the Wat Prathat Doi Suthep. The peak is named after the hermit Sudeva, who lived on the mountain's slopes for many years. The temple is 600 years old. After the drive up the mountain's winding road, the final climb to the site is via a magnificent Napa (dragonheaded serpent) staircase of 306 steps. Inside the cloisters is an intriguing copper-plated chedi topped by a five-tier gold umbrella which contains partial relics of Buddha. On a clear day, there are incomparable views over the city from the grounds of the temple. Before returning to Chiang Mai, walk to the nearby Jade Factory for some shopping.





Late this afternoon return to Chiang Mai where the remainder of your day is at leisure. We suggest enjoying dinner at one of the many local restaurants and if you're up to it, after dinner you have the option of visit the Night Bazaar — while many of the shops sell the usual tourist trinkets, there are also dozens of textile booths, adding up to an emporium of textiles from all over the region. Return to the hotel by "Tuk Tuk" which your guide can help you arrange at a cost of less than a dollar.

Your home for the next two nights is the Empress Hotel, located in the heart of Chiang Mai. Here you will find comfortable accommodations with amenities that include individual climate controls, wireless internet and three dining options with local cuisine.

DAY 10~TUESDAY~FEBRUARY 16 CHIANG MAI~LAMPANG

After breakfast drive to Lampang to visit the Elephant Hospital and Conservation Centre run by Mr. Richard Lair, Thailand's leading elephant expert. Experts there will speak to you about the modern pressures on the enormous pachyderms. 150 years ago Thailand had only 6 million people and was almost entirely covered by forest. Today there are more than 60 million people and only 20 percent of the country is covered by forest. Due to these massive changes in the country's setting the elephants cannot be released back into the wild. They will likely start crop raiding, and in the process injuring people and in turn people will start injuring them, so it's just too dangerous. Used primarily for logging in the past, unemployed elephants represent a big problem. Many end up in Bangkok on the city streets giving rides in order to earn their keep...not a terribly healthy environment. This conservation center is working on these issues. A single



elephant in the wild needs about 8,000 acres to survive, and there is little choice but to keep more than half the country's stock in captivity.

Watch the elephants demonstrate their logging and painting skills, and even their musical talents. Everyone will enjoy face to face meetings with the elephants however if you feed the elephants bananas and sugar cane you will receive a great thrill! You will have a chance to get a chance to practice driving an elephant, visit the hospital which gives free care to all elephants, and take a saddle-back ride through the forest.

Venture into the heart of Lampang, a city famous for its blue and white pottery. Take advantage of one their famous horse carriage rides to view some of the finest Burmese Temples in Thailand. Also found in the vicinity of Lampang is one of the most well preserved examples of northern Thai architechture, Wat Prathat Lampang Luang. Several large Bodhi trees surround the compound and it features an Emerald Buddha House and a small Phra Kaew Don Tao image wearing a gold



necklace and standing on a gold base, though it may be difficult to see. Enjoy lunch before continuing on to Lamphun.



Lamphun is the oldest continuously inhabited city in Thailand, dating back to 663 AD. Though the city is legendary for its beautiful women, Lamphun is perhaps best known for Wat Phrathat Hariphunchai, one of the most striking temples in all of Thailand, and after which Wat Prathat Doi Suthep is modeled. Overnight at EMPRESS HOTEL CHANG MAI. (B,L,D)

Day 11~Wednesday~February 17 CHIANG MAI~COOKING CLASS~WOOD CARVING AT BAN TAWAI~BANGKOK/EN ROUTE

Today you will learn to bring back the taste of Thailand long after your trip is over by going a Thai cooking school where you will prepare and eat a simple and delicious Thai meal. The Chiang Mai Thai Cookery School was established in 1993 and is a family business run by Sompon and Elizabeth Nabnian. They offer daily courses taught by Sompon who is an experienced Thai chef and who speaks excellent English. They will teach you the secrets of Thai cooking at our home in a relaxed atmosphere.

The Chiang Mai Thai Cookery School offers you a choice of 5 different courses. Each course has been designed as a one day course so that you will learn the main techniques for cooking Thai

food whichever course you attend. The courses that they offer are completely hands on which means that you will

prepare and cook all the dishes by yourself. The teachers have an extensive knowledge of Thai ingredients and cooking methods which they take pleasure in sharing with their students every day.

Afterwards, visit a major center of wood-carving, antique wood, basketry and earthenware in Ban Tawai.

In the late afternoon, transfer to the Chang Mai airport, where you'll connect to your flight, bound for Houston via Singapore.

DAY 11~WEDNESDAY~FEBRUARY 17 CHIANG MAI/BANGKOK/SIEM REAP

You have some leisure time to explore more of Chiang Mai or just relax at your hotel before boarding your flight to Siem Reap, via Bangkok, where you embark on a new adventure. Upon arrival you will be met and escorted to your small

boutique hotel.

Your home for the next three nights offers unrivaled comfort and authentic rustic charm. The verdant gardens flanking Angkor Village are immediately striking. Beautiful shades of lush greens in pleasing stands are punctuated with clusters of crimson ginger flowers, white lilies and clutches of orchids. Large trees front the cottage style room pavilions screen balconies and terraces, cocooning rooms in a lush, hushed privacy. In the early morning and evenings the chorus of frogs and geckos is proof of the thriving environment. When the birdsong starts with the sunrise within the jungle-picturesque gardens, it is hard not to feel perfectly relaxed and miles from an






urban lifestyle. The staff is very welcoming. The pool is small but picturesque in a lush courtyard at the rear. The Auberge de Temples Restaurant is on a small island in the central pond and serves fine French and Khmer cuisines. The hotel's Apsara Theater Restaurant, just outside the gate, has Khmer-style banquet dining and performances of Khmer Apsara dancing nightly. Rooms are rustic with high bamboo ceilings, wood beams, built-in cabinetry, comfortable beds, and decorative touches like traditional Khmer shadow puppets and statuary. The central lobby is a series of platforms and private sitting areas, a good place to rest after a day at the temples. The restaurant offers refined Indochinese cuisine to tempt your palate.

DAY 12~THURSDAY~FEBRUARY 18 SIEM REAP/ANGKOR THOM & ANGKOR WAT

This morning, begin your exploration of the Angkor complex with the magnificent and monumental Angkor Thom, the last capital of the Khmers, surrounded by a quadrangle of defensive walls totaling over seven miles. Awaiting within, you will find the stunning Bayon temple – a 12th century masterpiece with over 200 bas-relief 'faces' peering out from its walls. The afternoon is filled with the sights and sounds of the temples of Thommanon, Chao Say Tevoda and Ta Keo. See how the roots of the giant fig and kapok trees have spread like tentacles throughout the 12th century Ta Prohm temple, which has been left largely in its natural state since its "re-discovery" by French explorers.

This afternoon, visit Angkor Wat, the largest temple in the world conceived by Suryavarman II and generally believed to have been his funeral temple. The temple is the epitome of the high classical style of Khmer architecture. It has become a symbol of Cambodia,



appearing on its national flag, and it is the country's prime attraction for visitors. Angkor Wat combines two basic plans of Khmer temple architecture: the temple mountain and the later galleried temples. It is designed to represent Mount Meru, home of the gods in Hindu mythology. Within a moat and an outer wall 2.2 miles long are three rectangular galleries, each raised above the next. At the center of the temple stands a quincunx of towers. Unlike most Angkorian temples, Angkor Wat is orientated to the west; scholars are divided as to the significance of this. As well as for the grandeur and harmony of the architecture, the temple is admired for its extensive bas-reliefs and for the numerous devas adorning its walls. Since the decline of the Khmer Watch the

exotic colors of the sun set over its galleries this evening. Overnight at ANGKOR VILLAGE RESORT. (B,L)

Day 13~Friday~ February 19 Siem Reap/Tonle Sap Lake/Floating Village/Les Artisan D'Angkor

After breakfast, board a small shaded boat to traverse the largest fresh water lake in South East Asia, Tonle Sap Lake. Navigate between floating homes and small fish farms to experience a centuries-old way of life and culture.

Return to Siem Reap and visit a development project that teaches young adults stone and wood carving skills, as well as lacquer application. Les Artisans d' Angkor is a heartwarming reminder that progress in Cambodia can go hand in hand with traditional crafts.

Day 14~Saturday~February 20 Siem Reap/En Route


Spend the day exploring Siem Reap town where you will have some time at leisure to shop in the local markets. This afternoon, return to Siem Reap's airport and board your international flight back to the United States.

- Should generally be in good health and prepared to travel in locations without medical facilities.


In general, this trip requires:

HOW TO BOOK: Fill out the reservation form below and send it to Texas A & M Traveling Aggies-505 George Bush Drive, College Station, Texas 77840. Upon receipt of your signed reservation form and deposit, we will, subject to availability, reserve your spot on the tour. You may consider your booking confirmed when you receive a confirmation notice and invoice from us.

PAYMENTS

DEPOSIT: A deposit of \$750 per person for the main program and \$250 for the extension must be submitted at the time of booking. Deposits may be paid by check or charged to American Express, MasterCard, Visa or Discover.

FINAL PAYMENT: Final payment is due 95 days (**November 3, 2015**) before departure – you will receive a final invoice. Final payment is payable by check or money order ONLY.

RATES: Rates are based on the minimum number of guests outlined in this document, plus airfare costs, currency exchange rates and other factors and are subject to change. Though it is rare for Classic Escapes to make a price adjustment after promotion of an itinerary, we do reserve the right to assess a surcharge if the minimum is not met, or if increases are forced upon us by airlines or other partners or because of changes in currency exchange rates.

NOT INCLUDED: Cost of passport and visa fees, and service charges for obtaining visa fees; excess baggage charges levied by airlines; laundry and other items of a personal nature; optional personal, optional travel insurance policy; cost for anything not specifically included in listing above.

SINGLE SUPPLEMENT: The quoted rate is valid for the first two single rooms booked and on a first-come, first-served basis. CANCELLATIONS, DEVIATIONS & CHANGES

TRAVEL INSURANCE: We recommend travel insurance. Travel insurance can provide financial reimbursement should the unexpected occur.

CANCELLATION POLICY: Cancellations are only effective on receipt of written notification. The following per person fees are applicable on this tour:

- Up to 95 days prior to departure, less \$250 handling fee.
- 94-75 days prior to departure, deposit is forfeited.
- 74-60 days prior to departure, less 50% of tour cost on both the main trip and either extension.

TRANSFERS: Roundtrip airport transfers are included in the tour for guests arriving on group flights. If travelers make their own air arrangements, they will be subject to extra transfer fees.

TRIP DETAILS

ACCOMMODATIONS: You will marvel at the wonderful accommodations provided throughout your tour. All rooms have private bathroom facilities and air conditioning and/or fans.
