DAY 1~SUNDAY~JULY 24 HOUSTON/EN ROUTE

Begin your journey as you board your flight London. (Meals Aloft)

Day 2~Monday ~ July 25 London

Arrive in London's Heathrow Airport where you will be met by your Specialist Guide and escorted to your hotel, Double Tree by Hilton, Islington.

The great British author Samuel Johnson had it right when he wrote of London:

"You find no man, at all intellectual, who is willing to leave London. No, sir, when a man is tired of London, he is tired of life; for there is in London all that life can afford."

London is a cosmopolitan mixture of the Third and First Worlds, of chauffeurs and beggars, of the establishment, the avowedly working class and the avantgarde. There is an endless list of world-class museums, monuments, buildings, churches and historical sites. With a population of just under eight million,



(one-eighth the population of England, Scotland and Wales) London is Europe's largest city, spreading across an area of more than 620 square miles from its core on the River Thames. But to many travelers it never really feels big, as each of the 32 boroughs possesses a character, lore, and rhythm all its own. There is the heraldic splendor of Westminster, the chic of artistic Chelsea, the architectural elegance of Belgravia and Mayfair, the cosmopolitan charm of Soho and the East End, and of course the theater scene of the West End and its fringes.

London's reputation as a theater-rich city can be traced to the support and appreciation for the arts during the Elizabethan era. It was the time of the great English playwrights Christopher Marlowe and William Shakespeare. Elizabeth's reign saw the construction of the first permanent theaters in London including, The Theatre (1576), the Rose (1587), the Swan (1595), and the theater that would be most closely linked with Shakespeare, the Globe. The theaters of the West End, London's theater district, are drenched in history and each has a special story to tell. Known as "Theatreland," due to the presence of over 40 theaters, this posh performing arts hub is where the well sorted crowd such as famous actors and businessmen, rub shoulders. Today, London Theaters are more than just a venue for a show penned by an acclaimed playwright and performed by a gifted thespian: Today these theaters are wonderful lessons



in history, augurs of changing times, and testaments to the need of the audience to escape daily trials and tribulations.



Your home for the next six nights is Double Tree by Hilton, Islington. Well-located between London's high fashion houses, financial powerhouses and the West End's packed theater houses, Islington is right at the hub of a transport network that gets you to all the delights that London has to offer. The intimate hotel offers a warm and friendly atmosphere along with all the modern amenities including in-room Wi-Fi access, flat screen TV, tea and coffee maker, and a hairdryer. There is a hotel bar and restaurant for your dining pleasure.

Tonight enjoy a welcome dinner to get better acquainted with your fellow travelers. Overnight at the DOUBLE TREE BY HILTON ISLINGTON, or similar. (B Aloft, D) www.Hilton Islington Hotel - hilton.com

Day 3 ~ Tuesday ~ July 26 London City Tour & Theater Performance

Begin your exploration and discovery of London proper on your morning panoramic tour featuring major London sites such as Knightsbridge and perhaps the most famous retail therapy haven of



them all, Harrods. See also Hyde Park, Piccadilly Circus, Trafalgar Square, Houses of Parliament, Westminster Abbey, River Thames, St. Paul's Cathedral, and the Tower of London.

After lunch on your own continue to Buckingham Palace where you will visit the Queen's Gallery, which exhibits art from the Royal Collection. This collection, owned by the Queen "in trust for the nation", is displayed on a rotation of approximately 450 pieces at a time. Next continue to the British Museum which was established in 1753 and is dedicated to human history and culture. Its permanent collection, numbering some 8 million works, is among the largest and most comprehensive in existence and originates from all continents, illustrating and documenting the story of human culture from its beginnings to the present. Within its priceless collection, you will view the Rosetta Stone, a valuable key to understanding Egyptian hieroglyphs which increased understanding of Egyptian culture; the Elgin Marles, also known as the Parthenon Marbles, a collection of classical Greek sculptures that were originally part of the Parthenon and other buildings on the Acropolis of Athens; the Portland Vase, the best known piece of Roman cameo glass vase dating to between AD 1 and AD 25.

Tonight is the exposition of your London theater adventure as you see the first of your three included theater performances. While the actual shows will be picked closer to your departure date, you will have a chance to see a major musical on the West End tonight. Roundtrip coach transfer to the theater and back to your hotel is included. Overnight at the DOUBLE TREE BY HILTON ISLINGTON, or similar. (B) *Note: Theater performances and schedules are subject to change.*

Day 4 ~ Wednesday ~ July 27

LONDON: WALLACE COLLECTION & NATIONAL GALLERY

Continue on your discovery of what London has to offer to art lovers and visit The Wallace Collection and its Great Gallery described as "the greatest picture gallery in Europe" which has been recently refurbished at a cost of £5m. Though the Wallace Collection is known for its superb 18th and 19th century French paintings and decorative art, the wealthy Marquises of Hertford bought what they liked, not what they thought was fashionable. As a result there is something to appreciate for every taste: Paintings by the masters such as Titian and Rembrandt; one of the biggest collections of arms and body armor; Rococo Sevres porcelain; and 16thC Turkish Iznik pottery. The museum is also home



to the famous Frans Hals painting *The Laughing Cavalier*. Spend your morning learning about some of the finest and most interesting historic works.

Head out for the National Gallery located on the north end of Trafalgar Square. Though the 1838 William Wilkens design was controversial when first proposed, its façade has withstood the tests of time and continues to act as a gateway to some 2,000 works of priceless art paintings from the middle ages to the 20th century. Here you can find works by Botticelli, Leonardo da Vinci, Rembrandt, Rubens, Van Dyck, Michelangelo, Raphael, Renoir, Van Gogh, and many others.

After a brief introduction at both venues, you will be free to discover at your own pace. Overnight at the DOUBLE TREE BY HILTON ISLINGTON, or similar. (B)


Day $5 \sim Thursday \sim July 28$

LONDON: ST PAUL'S CATHEDRAL, THE TATE MODERN ART GALLERY & GLOBE THEATRE

First stop is at one of London's most loved landmarks, St Paul's Cathedral, which has looked over the city for more than

three centuries. St Paul's Cathedral sits at the top of Ludgate Hill, the highest point in London and is the seat of the Bishop of London and the mother church of the Diocese of London. St. Paul's Cathedral has had an eventful history. Five different churches were built at this site. The last cathedral was built in a relatively short time span: Its first stone was laid on June 21, 1675 and the building was completed in 1711. The dome reaches a height of 366 ft. and weighs about 66,000 tons. Eight arches support the dome. On top of the dome is a large lantern with a weight of 850 tons. The Baroque interior of the cathedral is just as magnificent as the exterior.

Walk over the Millennium Bridge to the Tate Modern art gallery, one of London's most popular attractions, in the former Bankside power station on the Queen's Walk, Southbank. Sir Giles Scott, who designed this outstanding modern and contemporary building, was also the designer of Battersea power station and the iconic London red telephone box. It opened to the public in the year 2000 and has become one of the most visited Art Galleries in the world. Tate Modern features works by Rothko,



Matisse, Dali, Cezanne and Picasso, and contemporary works by Matthew Barney, Chris Ofili and Gerhard Richter.

Step back in time as you explore Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, a unique resource that is more than a performance space: It

is also dedicated to the exploration of The Bard's work and the playhouse for which he wrote, through connected means of performance and education. The theatre is a faithful reconstruction of the open air playhouse designed in 1599 and as true to the original as modern research and traditional craftsmanship can make it. On your visit you will take a guided tour of the theatre itself with expert guide/storytellers who will recall some of the colorful stories of 1599 and explain how the reconstruction process took place in the 1990's. You will top off your tour with entry into the Shakespeare Exhibition which brings the playwright's world to life using a range of interactive displays and live demonstrations. Discover how shows were produced in the theaters of Shakespeare's time, including writing, rehearsals, music, dance, and performance. Cast your eyes upon elaborate Elizabethan costumes or create your own





Shakespearean phrases. Dinner is on your own and at the Globe complex you can choose to eat at The Bar or the Brasserie.

Your visit is made complete by attending a performance here this evening. Afterwards, your motor coach will bring you back to our hotel. *Note: Theater performances and schedules are subject to change.*Overnight at the DOUBLE TREE BY HILTON ISLINGTON, or similar. (B)

Day 6 ~ Friday ~ July 29 Windsor Castle & London Museums



Travel a short way to the town of Windsor that despite its 1000-year history, is actually a "new" Windsor, Old Windsor lying two miles downstream on the Thames. This ancient town has been the site of royal residence since William the Conqueror, and the vestiges of succeeding dynastic succession is evident in the multi-faceted architectural flourishes of the sprawling Castle. Travel back to a distant age of conquering kings, Royal hunting forests and genteel court life. Regard the gardens and splendid state apartments which are full up with portraits, fine furnishings, and lavish decorations. The exquisite 15th Century Chapel in the castle precincts is the home of the Order of the Garter and the burial place of many English kings and queens, including Henry VIII, Charles I and the late Queen

Mother. Your guide will escort you round this Royal residence sharing with you its history. You will have some free time for lunch in Windsor.

Drive back to visit the Tate Britain, an art gallery situated on Millbank in London, and part of the Tate gallery network in Britain, with Tate Modern, Tate Liverpool and Tate St Ives. It is the oldest gallery in the network, having opened in 1897. The guide will give you an introductory talk and leave you to enjoy the collection independently.

Afterwards transfer to Somerset House, a large Neoclassical building designed in 1776, situated on the south side of the Strand in Central London which serves as a major arts

and cultural center. During the summer months, 55 fountains dance in the courtyard and in winter you can skate on London's favorite ice rink. It features contemporary art and design exhibitions and is home to London Fashion Week. Your visit includes admission to the Courtauld Gallery and an introductory talk.

Return to your hotel late afternoon where you have free time before being transferred to the West End to attend your third theater performance. *Note: Theater performances and schedules are subject to change.*Overnight at the DOUBLE TREE BY HILTON ISLINGTON, or similar. (B)



Day 7 ~ Saturday ~ July 30 Stonehenge & Bath

Today you leave London to visit Stonehenge, one of Britain's most enduring icons. Its original purpose is unclear: Speculations suggest that it was a temple made for the worship of ancient earth deities; that it was an astronomical observatory for marking significant events on the prehistoric calendar; that it was a sacred site for the burial of society's elite in ancient Britain. While we can't say with any degree of certainty what it was for, we can say that it wasn't constructed for any casual purpose. Only something very important to the ancients would have been worth the effort and investment that it took to construct Stonehenge.



Next you will travel to Bath for a walking tour. Due to its hot springs, the city was established as a spa by the Romans



sometime in the AD 60's about 20 years after they had arrived in Britain (AD43). The well-preserved Roman Baths themselves are below the modern street level. There are four main features, the Sacred Spring, the Roman Temple, the Roman Bath House and the Museum which holds relics recovered from the Roman Bath. The City of Bath was inscribed as a World Heritage Site in 1987. In addition to the Roman Baths, the city has a variety of theaters, museums, cultural and sporting venues, as well as two universities and several schools and colleges. Your visit will include entrance to the Fashion Museum at Bath.

Return to your hotel in late afternoon where you will have the balance of your day at leisure. Enjoy one of London's fine dining spots or another West End show on your last night in this exciting city.

Overnight at the DOUBLE TREE BY HILTON ISLINGTON, or similar.

REGISTRATION

HOW TO BOOK: Fill out the reservation form below and send it to Texas A & M Traveling Aggies- 505 George Bush Drive, College Station, Texas 77840. Upon receipt of your signed reservation form and deposit, we will, subject to availability, reserve your spot on the tour. You may consider your booking confirmed when you receive a confirmation notice and invoice from us.

PAYMENTS

DEPOSIT: A deposit of \$750 per person must be submitted at the time of booking. Deposits may be paid by check or charged to American Express, MasterCard, Visa or Discover.

FINAL PAYMENT: Final payment is due 95 days before departure (April 20, 2016) – you will receive a final invoice. Final payment is payable by check or money order ONLY.

RATES: Rates are based on the minimum number of guests outlined in this document, plus airfare costs, currency exchange rates and other factors and are subject to change. Though it is rare for Classic Escapes to make a price adjustment after promotion of an itinerary, we do reserve the right to assess a surcharge if the minimum is not met, or if increases are forced upon us by airlines or other partners or because of changes in currency exchange rates.

NOT INCLUDED: Cost of passport, excess baggage charges levied by airlines; laundry and other items of a personal nature; optional travel insurance policy; cost for anything not specifically included in listing above.

SINGLE SUPPLEMENT: The quoted rate is valid for the first two single rooms booked and on a first-come, first-served basis. If more than two single rooms are needed, an additional supplement may apply. Single accommodations are not guaranteed, but will be provided at additional cost if available (see reservation form for cost.) The single room supplement pays for privacy, not better accommodations. For passengers who are traveling alone and wish to share a room with another tour member, we will do our best to provide a roommate. However, if this is not possible, you will be required to pay the single room supplement prior to your departure from the USA.

GRATUITIES AND TAXES: Gratuities for baggage handling, service charges and taxes imposed by hotels, and entrance fees to all points of interest as outlined in the itinerary are included. U.S. and foreign airport taxes are included in air costs. Tips to drivers and guides are NOT included.

CANCELLATIONS, DEVIATIONS & CHANGES

TRAVEL INSURANCE: We recommend travel insurance. Travel insurance can provide financial reimbursement should the unexpected occur.

CANCELLATION POLICY: Cancellations are only effective on receipt of written notification. The following per person fees are applicable on this tour:

- Up to 95 days prior to departure, \$250 handling fee.
- 94-75 days prior to departure, deposit is forfeited.
- 74-60 days prior to departure, less 50% of tour cost.
- Less than 60 days prior to departure, 100% of tour cost.

These cancellation fees are also in addition to any fees imposed by airlines.

CHANGE FEES: Once you reserve your tour, changes are possible subject to availability of air or land space at the time of request. Should there be any change fees imposed by airlines or ground operators, or additional costs incurred due to availability of any space, this cost will be invoiced to you.

SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS: We would be happy to make additional travel plans for you, including specially arranged pre- or post-tour extensions different than those that may be offered in conjunction with this tour. A service charge of \$150 per person (over and above the cost of the services required) will be assessed.



DOCUMENTS

PASSPORT & VISAS: The onus is upon the guest to ensure that passports are valid for the countries visited and for the applicable time period, as outlined by the U.S. Department of State (travel.state.gov) or by the passport holder's country. Classic Escapes, their staff and their agents cannot be held liable for any visas, etc. not held by the guests, nor for the cost of obtaining visas. US Citizens do not require visas to visit Great Britain.

PRE-DEPARTURE INFORMATION: Upon receipt of your registration and deposit, we will send a pre-departure packet to you. This packet contains all the information you need to prepare for your tour, including the complete itinerary, packing checklist, required documents, etc.

FINAL DOCUMENTS: Final documents and tickets will be sent to you approximately two weeks prior to departure, provided all monies have been paid in full.

TRANSPORTATION

OPTIONAL AIR TRANSPORTATION: Roundtrip, economy-class flights via BRITISH AIRWAYS and/or other IATAN carriers are offered between HOUSTON and LONDON. Rates are based on special promotional fares; cancellation fees apply once tickets are issued. Departures from other cities in the USA are possible at additional cost; inquire at the time of reservation. Please note that these promotional fares are subject to 10 passengers traveling together on the same airline routing and itinerary. If this minimum is not met, the special group rates are not applicable and it might become necessary to issue instant purchase tickets earlier than when final payment is due in order to take advantage of airfares that are similar to the group rates. AIRLINE SEATING: For **BRITISH AIRWAYS**, we request seats together for the group. All planes are non-smoking. We can request a seating preference on your behalf, however requested seats cannot be guaranteed. Requests should be made in writing no later than 60 days prior to departure. Bulkhead and/or emergency row seats can only be requested at airport check-in on the day of departure. Boarding passes will only be issued at the airport on the day of departure. You may inquire about seat changes during check in, based on availability and is at the sole discretion of airport staff.

TRANSFERS: Roundtrip airport transfers are included in the tour for guests arriving on group flights. If travelers make their own air arrangements, they will be subject to extra transfer fees.

ACCOMMODATIONS: You will marvel at the wonderful accommodations provided throughout your tour. All rooms have private bathroom facilities and air conditioning and/or fans. All rates are based on double occupancy. Most rooms are twin-bedded, but king-size beds are occasionally available and should be requested in advance. Accommodations listed in this itinerary are correct at time of writing, but on rare occasions may be substituted for a different property of comparable quality.

Despite this weight allowance, we always suggest guests travel light.
