Stroll past the neoclassical Gallery of Modern Art, prestigious city chambers and Glasgow School of Art. Explore Gothic Glasgow Cathedral, the only Scottish cathedral to survive the Reformation still intact. Examine its evocative stone screen representing the seven deadly sins and St. Mungo's tomb.

Local Flavor: Enjoy lunch at a restaurant in Glasgow.

Educational Focus: *Meet the People.* Participate in a discussion with local Scots and learn about contemporary Scottish life.

THE TROSSACHS NATIONAL PARK Excursion: Loch Lomond and the

Trossachs. Travel through wild Scottish Highlands to the bonnie banks of Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park, Scotland's first national park and home of legendary Rob Roy MacGregor. In the charming village of Luss, pass historic cottages adorned with rambling roses, and visit the 19th-century parish church with its lovely Scots pine rafters and Victorian stainedglass windows. This afternoon, ascend through Aberfoyle and beautiful parkland to witness fabled Loch Katrine. This inspiration for Sir Walter Scott's Poem, "The Lady of the Lake," glitters before a forested mountain backdrop. **Local Flavor:** Enjoy lunch and feast your eyes on panoramas of sparkling Loch Lomond.

ST ANDREWS Educational Focus: *The Stewart Line and the Jacobite Rebellions.*

Excursion: *St Andrews.* Visit towering National Wallace Monument before continuing to St Andrews to explore the city's medieval castle ruins, dramatically poised at the edge of the sea. Envision the scale and majesty of 12th-century St Andrews Cathedral from the Gothic remnants that still stand. View the cathedral's Christian medieval artifacts and Austrian oak choir. See the hallowed turf of the Old Course, where golf has been played since the 15th century.

Educational Focus: Scotland Today.

Excursion: Scone Palace and the Famous

Grouse Experience. Travel to the fair city of Perth and visit Scone Palace. The elegant Georgian mansion is the ancient coronation site of Scottish monarchs, including Robert



the Bruce. Roam sumptuous rooms filled with French furniture, and rare collections of papier-mâché, porcelain and unusual clocks. Amid strutting peacocks, explore the worldrenowned grounds, including the famous Murray Star Maze comprised of 2,000 beech trees. Continue to the town of Crieff and Glenturret Distillery, Scotland's oldest working distillery and home of The Famous Grouse. Original owner Matthew Gloag created a whisky to honor Queen Victoria using pure Scottish water, the finest grains, and handmade oak casks. Sample those results, and discover the secrets behind the centuriesold blending process still used today.

DAY SEVEN

Independent Exploration: Enjoy leisure time this morning.

Excursion: *Edinburgh and the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo.* View dramatic Forth Bridge, one of the longest single cantilever bridges in the world, then continue to Scotland's dynamic capital. Visit Edinburgh Castle crowning the black crags of Castle Rock, and discover its pivotal role in Scottish history. See the crown jewels,



enigmatic Stone of Destiny, and luxurious Royal Palace where Mary Queen of Scots gave birth to James VI. Traverse The Royal Mile down into the heart of Edinburgh's atmospheric Old Town. Later tonight, experience an unforgettable evening performance of the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo. This compendium of precision marching bands, drill teams, pyrotechnics and Highland dancing is performed on the floodlit esplanade of Edinburgh Castle. Steeped in military tradition, the ceremonial pageant grew from an 18th-century custom, when the British regimental band performed to alert troops it was time to quit the saloons and return to the barracks.

Independent Exploration: Choose a restaurant for dinner on your own, and explore the eclectic shops of Old Town.

DAY EIGHT

Independent Exploration: Today is at leisure. Take a complimentary shuttle to Edinburgh, explore Glasgow's environs or enjoy more time in Glasgow itself.

Tonight, celebrate with fellow travelers at a Graduation Ceremony and Farewell Reception. Enjoy a Farewell Dinner, followed by a festive, music-filled ceilidh, a traditional Celtic party.
