exas A&M, perhaps above all else, is unique. The bond we form as students that carries through the rest of our lives and to every part of the globe is unique. The affinity we have for traditions, while maintaining an imperative to innovate, is unique. The way we support each other is unique.

Fact: Aggies take care of each other. This has been proved with countless tales of current and former students going out of their way to make sure other Aggies get where they need to go and connect with whom they need to see.

The Association of Former Students has been helping Aggies get where they need to go for 140 years. From "howdy" to "here," we support programs, provide resources and cultivate experiences for the entire Aggie Network. In 2018 alone, we awarded 1,823 academic scholarships, brought 3,941 Aggies together at the All-Aggie Tailgate, traveled 30,156 miles to visit Texas A&M Clubs, delivered 15,506 Aggie Rings and facilitated hundreds of Musters around the world. We provided a \$13.6 million impact to Texas A&M and are a leader in alumni giving and among alumni groups.

But we can do more. We *need* to do more. And we can't do it alone.

Because of generous donors to The Association's Aggie Ring Scholarship program, in 2018, 114 students received a scholarship for their Aggie Ring. Those students make up less than one quarter of one percent of that year's student population. Also in 2018, more than 10,000 former students were helped by Former Student Career

Services, which The Association financially supports, but that is only about 2 percent of living former students. For 2018, not quite 13 percent of the Aggie Network gave back through The Association.

We can do more. We *need* to do more. You can help.

The Association has laid out a bold vision: to engage 100,000 donors annually for Texas A&M by 2020. The reason why is simple: more. More academic scholarships; more support for traditions and the Corps of Cadets; more Muster resources; more Aggies helping more Aggies. We can get there. You can help.

Cathy Mann '92, our 2020 Association Chair of the Board, said: "If everyone who donates today can help us connect with one more former student or friend, we can exceed our goal easily. It will take everyone pulling together to make it happen, and I believe Aggies can and will achieve this goal."

Each of these donors is counted toward the 100,000 goal, but each is only counted once. At 58,406 in 2018, donors to The Association make up the vast majority of the 100,000 goal and allow The Association to support Aggie experiences that tuition and state funding don't apply to or fully cover. And every dollar given to The Association through this effort contributes to the university's \$4 billion Lead By Example campaign, which also culminates at the end of 2020.




FORT RUCKER A&M CLUB

This premier group is named for a man who made a significant impact on all Aggies by dedicating years of his own energy and inspiration: E.E. McQuillen, Class of 1920, was the second head of The Association of Former Students and during his 1926-47 tenure made an incredible difference to countless A&M students and former students. His staff at the beginning was two people, including himself, but he galvanized others into building an incredible network: He encouraged creation of A&M Clubs statewide and outside Texas; he leveraged the fame of the 1942 Muster on Corregidor to inspire hundreds of Muster meetings worldwide; he focused the drive to build a Memorial Student Center; and by inspiring Aggies to give back, he created student loan funds and opportunity scholarships that allowed thousands of Aggies to stay in school during the Depression and after.

During the year, there will be specific campaigns and outreach periods in which McQuillen Society volunteers will participate.

As gestures of thanks for their work, volunteers will receive recognitions such as a specially-designed year bar to hang on their Association plaque, a digital badge on their AggieNetwork.com online profile and, based on success, a variety of exclusive opportunities throughout the year. But the main reward will be the strength they add to the Aggie Network.


- Share with others the reasons why they give and connect former students to The Association.


